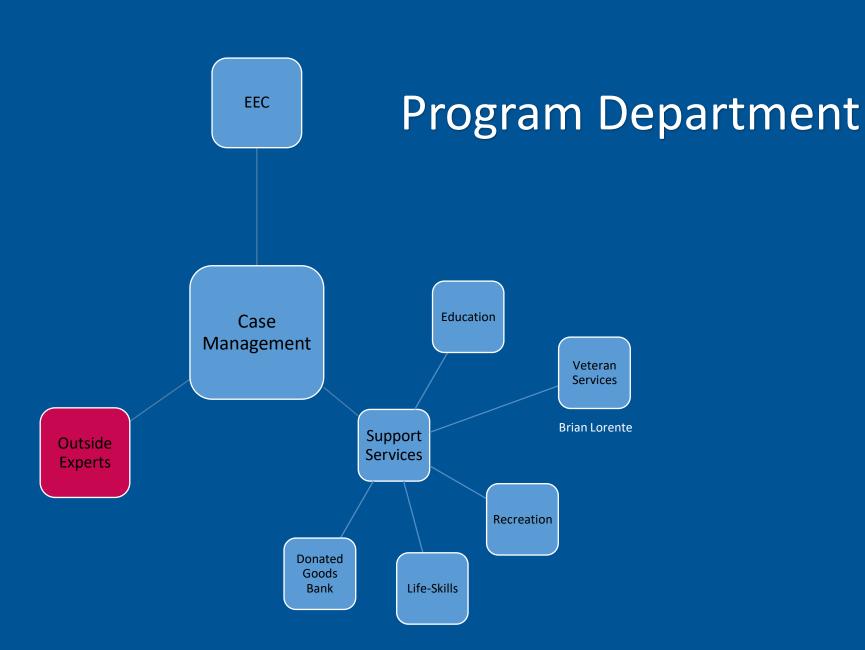

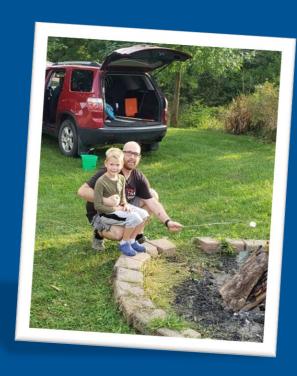

Application Process

Inquiry

• Inquiry: Caller connects with a helpline specialist to determine eligibility to receive an application

Apply

• Application: Eligible callers are mailed a paper application for the program

Initial Review • Start of assessment process of whether to close or continue the application to the next phase.

Interview

• Assigned case managers will contact them to schedule interviews. We typically conduct 3-4 interviews where we gather information about the family, background, motivation, goals and begin to develop a possible productivity plan

Reference

• We contact references provided by the applicants

Final Review

• Application, interview responses, references and other collected information is presented to the team to make a final recommendation

Closure/ Admission • Three outcomes: accepted, off-campus, closed



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
